



### THIEPVAL MEMORIAL

Year unveiled:	1932
No. of years to build:	4
Height:	43m
No. of visitors per year:	150,000

**Historical significance:**  
The Thiepval Memorial to the Missing of the Somme is a war memorial to the 72,246 missing British and South African servicemen who died in the Battles of the Somme with no known grave.



### STATUE OF LIBERTY

Year unveiled:	1886

Height:	93m
No. of visitors per year:	4 million

**Historical significance:**  
The Statue of Liberty was given to the United States from France to celebrate their friendship during the American Revolution. It has come to symbolise the freedom and the democracy of the United States.



### LINCOLN MEMORIAL

No. of visitors per year:	6 million

**Historical significance:**  
The Lincoln Memorial is an American national monument built to honour the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln.



### SEPTEMBER 11<sup>TH</sup> MEMORIAL

No. of visitors per year:	4 million

**Historical significance:**  
The National September 11 Memorial in New York City was built to commemorate the September 11, 2001 attacks.



### MENIN GATE

Year unveiled:	1927

No. of visitors per year:	200,000

**Historical significance:**  
The Menin Gate Memorial to the Missing in Ypres is dedicated to the British and Commonwealth soldiers who were killed in the Ypres Salient of World War I and whose graves are unknown.



### THE KREMLIN

No. of visitors per year:	15 million

**Historical significance:**  
Under Ivan the Great, the Kremlin became the centre of a unified Russian state.



### BRANDENBURG GATE

**Historical significance:**  
The Brandenburg Gate is an 18th-century monument, built on the orders of Prussian king Frederick William II after the successful restoration of order during the early Batavian Revolution.



### THE BERLIN WALL

**Historical significance:**  
The Berlin Wall was a guarded concrete barrier that physically and ideologically divided Berlin from 1961 to 1989.

\*The Berlin Wall was built over a long period of time and there were different stages of its build. It was extended up until the fall of the Berlin



### THE REICHSTAG

No. of visitors per year:	10 million

**Historical significance:**  
The Reichstag is a historic edifice in Berlin, constructed to house the Imperial Diet of the German Empire.

\*From the set-up of the Anne Frank Foundation to the opening of the building to the public.



### ANNE FRANK HOUSE

Height:	2.8m
No. of visitors per year:	1 million

**Historical significance:**  
It was here, in the secret annexe, that Anne Frank hid from the Nazis during the war.

\*Opened to the public as a museum.



### HERMITAGE MUSEUM

No. of visitors per year:	2.9 million

**Historical significance:**  
Founded when Empress Catherine the Great acquired a large collection of paintings, the museum currently houses the largest collection of paintings in the world.

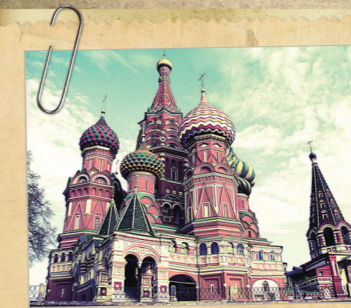


### NUREMBERG RALLY GROUNDS

Year unveiled:	1933*

Height:	39m
No. of visitors per year:	250,000

**Historical significance:**  
The Nuremberg Rally Grounds are where Hitler held his propaganda Nazi rallies between 1933 and 1938.

\*\*Construction began in 1933 and developments were made until 1939



### ST BASIL'S CATHEDRAL

No. of visitors per year:	15 million

**Historical significance:**  
Built on orders from Ivan the Terrible, St Basil's Cathedral commemorates the capture of Kazan and Astrakhan.



### ARC DE TRIOMPHE

No. of visitors per year:	1.2 million

**Historical significance:**  
The Arc de Triomphe honours those who fought and died for France in the French Revolutionary and Napoleonic Wars.



### WESTMINSTER ABBEY

**Historical significance:**  
One of the UK's most notable religious buildings and the traditional place of coronation and burial site for British monarchs.

### BUCKINGHAM PALACE

**Historical significance:**  
Buckingham Palace is the residence and administrative headquarters of the reigning monarch of the UK.

### TOWER OF LONDON

**Historical significance:**  
The Tower of London has played an important part in English history and has had many uses over the years, most notably as the home of the Crown Jewels of England.

### HADRIAN'S WALL

**Historical significance:**  
Begun in 122 AD, Hadrian's Wall was a defensive fortification in the Roman province of Britannia.



### EIFFEL TOWER

No. of visitors per year:	7 million

**Historical significance:**  
The Eiffel Tower has become a global cultural icon of France and is one of the most recognisable structures in the world.



### SAGRADA FAMILIA

No. of visitors per year:	3 million

**Historical significance:**  
Gaudi's masterpiece is the most famous landmark in Barcelona and even though it doesn't house a bishop, it is often referred to as 'the Cathedral' owing to its size and beauty.

### NOTRE DAME CATHEDRAL

No. of years to build:	182*
Height:	69m
No. of visitors per year:	13 million

**Historical significance:**  
Construction began during the reign of King Louis VII under the orders of Bishop de Sully who devoted most of his life and wealth to its construction.
