	I had studied before the party.	She has studied a lot.	<i>He will have studied before his parents come home.</i>
PERFECT	An action that happened over time in the past before another action.	An action that happens over time, starting in the past and continuing into the present.	An action that happens over time in the future before another action.
	Eg. Had been studying.	Eg. Have/has been studying.	Eg. Will have been studying.
	He had been studying for a while when he started school.	I have been studying since I started school.	We will have been studying for several hours before we can complete the task.
