COP26 THIS REALLY MATTERS "The World's last best hope to limit global warming."

What is COP26?

COP stands for Conference of the Parties. **197 countries** (or parties to a climate change treaty) meet annually to negotiate a global response to climate change. This is the 26th meeting.



What about the 2015 Paris Agreement?

197 countries agreed to the following goals:

- To limit global heating to **1.5^oC**
- To achieve net zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050
- Each country would set its own emission reduction targets, to be reviewed every 5 years
- To spend \$100 billion a year in climate finance to help poorer countries by 2020

Why does COP26 matter?

The world needs to halve emissions over the **next decade** to reach net zero carbon emissions by **2050**, if we are to limit global heating **1.5^oC**.



WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT?

Limiting the temperature rise to **1.5°C** could:

- Reduce the number of people exposed to climate-related risks

- Reduce pressure on food security and human health
- Better **protect** small island states from sea level rise
- Cut extinction rates and preserve some coral reefs
- Reduce the risk of irreversible polar ice sheet melt

What is COP26 hoping to achieve?

- Secure global net zero emissions by **2050**
- Keep **1.5^oC** warming within reach
- Raise ambitions over the short and long term
- Protect communities and restore ecosystems
- Make good on the financial promise to pay \$100 billion per year to developing countries
- Accelerate action to tackle climate crisis
