

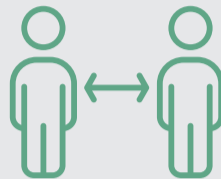

To curb the spread of infection using mild social restrictions.



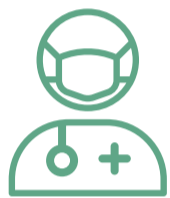
One-metre social distancing rule.

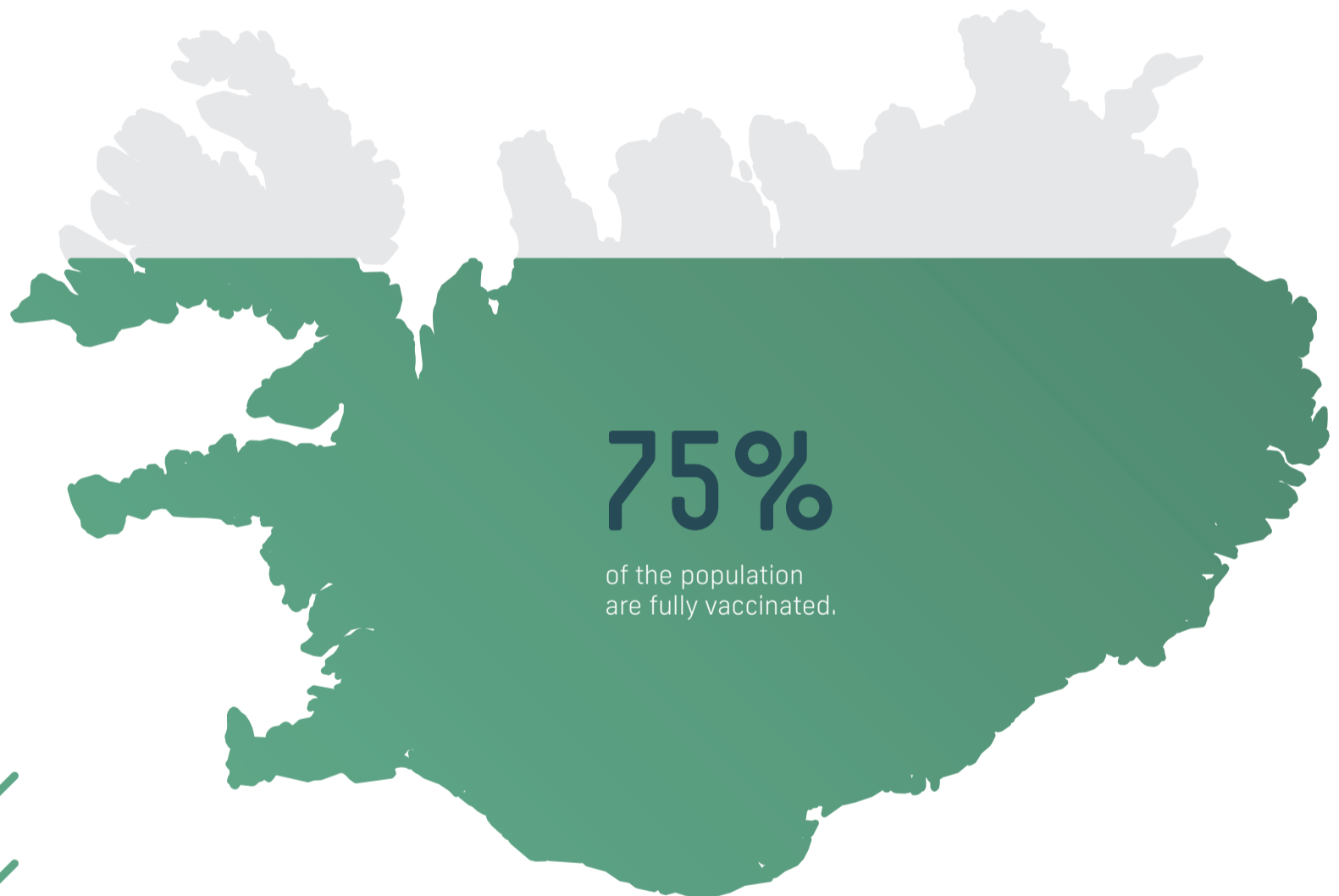

TRAVEL



Iceland is on the UK's travel 'green list'.



Children born in 2005 or later do not have to undergo testing at the border or present a negative PCR test upon arrival.



Iceland's borders open to residents of the Schengen Area, EEA, EFTA & EU.



As of April 6, 2021 travellers from outside these regions are allowed entry if they present a certificate of vaccination against COVID-19 or a certificate confirming previous COVID-19 infection.
